- Sometimes goes broke














If not this, what then?

"Entrepreneurship is neither a science nor an art. It is a practice... entrepreneurs <u>innovate</u>.





Could the fear be an excuse?


- **Because**



 - Hobby or interest




Finding Ideas





Your Ideas

- Can be close to home and maybe small
- Or Big, Huge, Global, Intergalactic
- Either way, you MUST prove their validity

REQUIRES A LOT OF RESEARCH

6-Slide Formula

- 1. Problem / Solution
- 2. Product / Service
- 3. Customer
- 4. Competition
- 5. Marketing
- 6. Will it make money?

- Ask these 6 questions every time
- Ask them at the start
- Get answers
- Or develop a good hypothesis
- Keep iterating till it works

Answers will come from RESEARCH - lots of it

- On the web
- Talk to people
- Talk to potential customers
- Talk to competition
- Surveys
- Observing
- * Emails
- * Talk a lot to people, and then some more



A Key Focus In This Class
